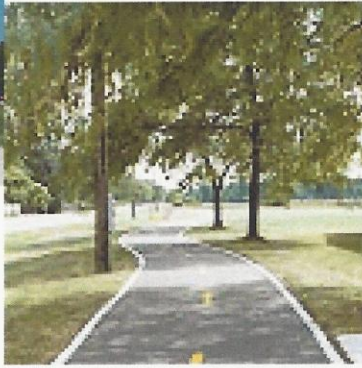


Oregon and Northwood

Parks and Recreation

One of the areas most famous parks, Maumee Bay State Park offers visitors 1,336 acres of lush wildlife to see and experience. In addition to the 11 miles of trails, 2 sand beaches, and an 18-hole golf course, the park also offers some of the best fishing and boating on Lake Erie.
